

What is Spaced Practice & Why is it an Effective Technique?

Why does revision help improve memory? Think about a time when you learned something new, like a passcode, only to forget it shortly after. Initially, when we learn something, it stays in our short-term memory. However, if we don't actively engage with that information again, our brain discards it as irrelevant. By revisiting and revising what we learn, we move that information from short-term to long-term memory.



Research from York University confirms that to retain knowledge long-term, students need to review material multiple times. This shows that cramming before an exam is not an effective study method. Instead, studies suggest that spreading revision over multiple, smaller sessions significantly improves retention.

This week, students were tasked with organizing their revision by identifying topics they plan to:

- **Revise**: An initial overview of a topic, summarizing key points.
- **Deep review**: A thorough session, which might include timed exam practice.
- **Quick review**: A brief recap, possibly with a quiz on essential information.

What can you do?

Encourage your child to share their revision schedule with you. Ask them about the subjects they plan to focus on each week—what will they revise, what topics need a deeper review, and which ones just need a quick refresher? You can also help by reminding them to revisit topics they've already covered to reinforce their memory. Regularly discussing their progress can keep them on track and reduce stress as exams approach.
